2020 SUMMER TAXES

2020 Elections

We've got one election completed, the presidential primary, and two more to come for 2020. The upcoming elections will be held August 4 (primary election) and November 3 (general election).

It is our full intention to offer these two elections consistent with the past by allowing voters the option of in-person voting at the Spaulding Township Hall or sending an absentee ballot to those who request them. Due to ongoing changes caused by the coronavirus, there may be new policies developed by the Secretary of State. Please check on line or watch the news carefully as we get closer to the election dates. The polling location will be set up with careful attention to social distances, hand sanitation and cleaning of touched surfaces.

You have already received at least one absentee ballot application in the mail and you may get more from other sources. Regardless of how many applications you receive, only one is needed to be sent to the township office for you to get an absentee ballot. We have made changes to allow for efficient handling of absentee ballots such as postal bar codes on new envelopes but be sure to get your completed ballot returned on time so that it can be counted.

For those who submitted an absentee ballot application for the March presidential primary election, you had the option of checking a box to request a ballot for both the March and November elections. There was not an option to also request a ballot for the August primary election on that form. Please submit a new application to request your August primary ballot.

++ FIRE DEPARTMENT ++

We currently have three individuals going through the Fire Academy, two that have recently graduated from First Responder class, and I have appointed Steve Becker as Lieutenant.

Spaulding Township Fire Department has been very involved over the last month assisting flood victims. We had the National Guard, a multitude of fire department agencies, along with resident volunteers that assisted us. The community really came together to help fill sand bags with a load of sand donated by Stephens Tile late in the evening and the following day. Red Cross provided flood cleaning kits, and a variety of supplies were donated by Holy Family Catholic Church and Lions 11-D1 District. Our local Fastway Party Store provided food and drinks for rescue personnel, the National Guard, and other community volunteers. We commend all those who dedicated their services for our residents during this crisis. Our township and its people are something I am proud to be a part of.

SPAULDING TOWNSHIP D.P.W.

We are pleased to announce that Don Ackerman is once again serving our township part-time as DPW Superintendent, overseeing and training Dan Kross, DPW Assistant Superintendent.

Drop Box: The township has a drop box outside our main door. Please use this for payments when possible instead of entering the lobby.

Water Wasters to Check:

Toilets: The flapper is the most common source of problems. Turn the water supply valve off at the toilet and watch the water level. If the level drops, replace the flapper and clean the flapper seal. Check the level in the tank after flushing; the water should shut off when the water is 1/2 to 1 inch below the overflow. If it doesn't, adjust the float in the tank. You can use a dye test or food coloring to confirm a toilet leak.

Water Softeners: After the softener has regenerated, check if water is still running down the drain. If it is, the softener needs to be repaired.

Faucets: Make sure all faucets are fully turned off. If it continues to drip, repair or replace it.

Overnight Leak Check: Find your water meter. Read and record it in the evening when done using water for the day. Pick a day that your softener will not be regenerating. Read it the next morning before using water. If the meter read changed overnight, you have a leak.
